

Ernest Taylor Pyle 1900 - 1945

Ernie Pyle was the most famous and beloved correspondent during World War II. His articles from the war's front brought home to people in the United States the personal stories of the brave men who served in that war.

At the time of his death in April of 1945, his articles were appearing in 400 daily newspapers and 300 weekly ones. He won a Pulitzer Prize in 1944.

He accomplished this by getting close to his subjects, living with them, accepting their hardships, and exposing himself to their dangers.

On April 18, 1945 he was killed by a Japanese sniper on the island of Pacific island of le Shima. He was only 44.



Ron May Portraying Ernie Pyle

Through a first person dramatization, Ron May performs a one-hour act on Ernie Pyle's experiences as a war correspondent.

Beginning with Pyle's visit to England in 1940, Ron traces Ernie's long travels through North Africa, Italy, England, France and finally the Pacific Islands.

At each stop in the combat journey, Ron speaks of what Pyle experienced there and shares excerpts of his most famous articles from that theater of war.

Wearing an authentic uniform like Pyle's, Ron uses World War II era props and projects photos of Pyle and the places he visited to enhance the presentation.

Besides his main focus on Pyle's life and work during the war, Ron can also add other modules to his presentation including:
